



First 5 Sacramento invested nearly **\$22 million** from July 2015 through June 2016 by providing prevention and early intervention programs to over 60,000 children ages 0-5, their parents and caregivers.

IMPROVED CHILD HEALTH

1,894 children were provided with assistance in establishing a medical home (health insurance)

551 pregnant women were provided prenatal support to prepare for a healthy baby

4,932 mothers received breastfeeding support

7,904 children received dental screenings

4,596 children received comprehensive developmental screenings or health assessments

4,892 children received services to prepare them for kindergarten

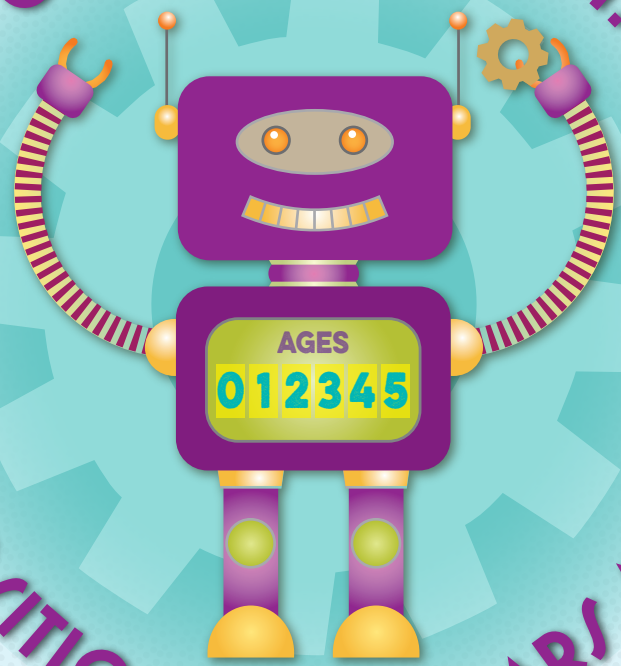
IMPROVED FAMILY FUNCTIONING

235 child development classrooms received support to increase the quality of care the teachers provide, serving over 6,000 children

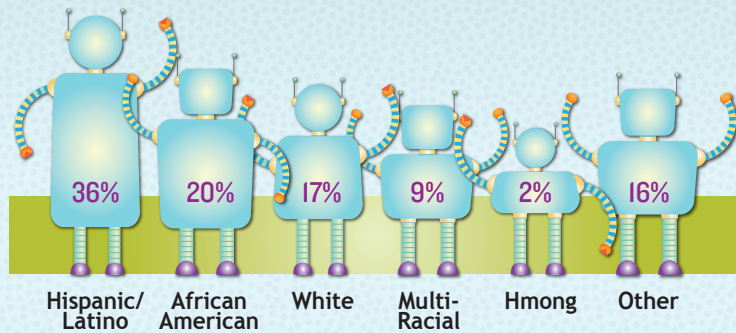

THE FUTURE OF FIRST 5 SACRAMENTO

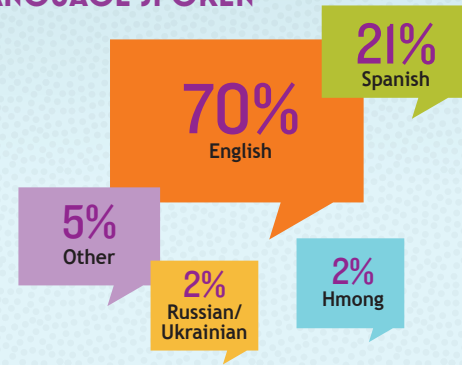

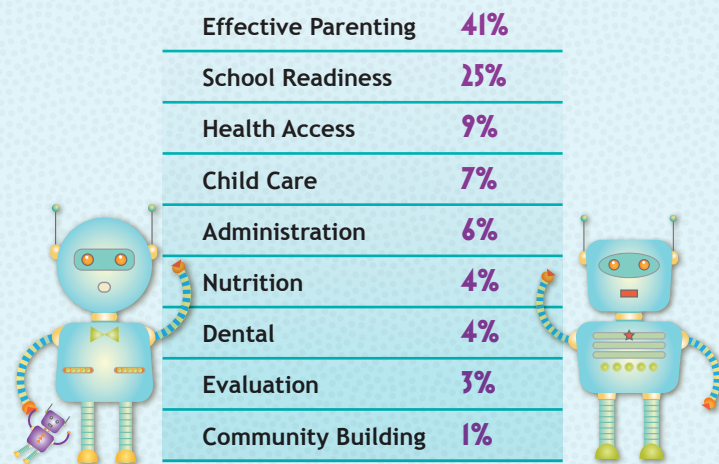
RACE/ETHNICITY



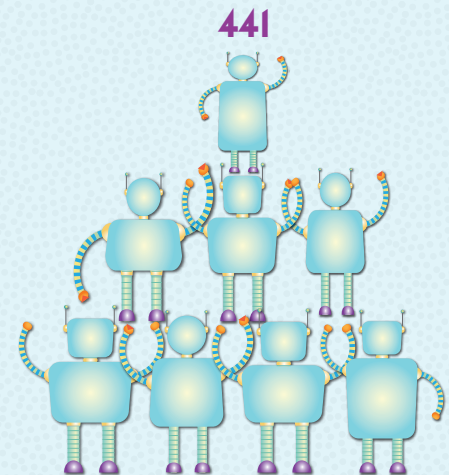
LANGUAGE SPOKEN



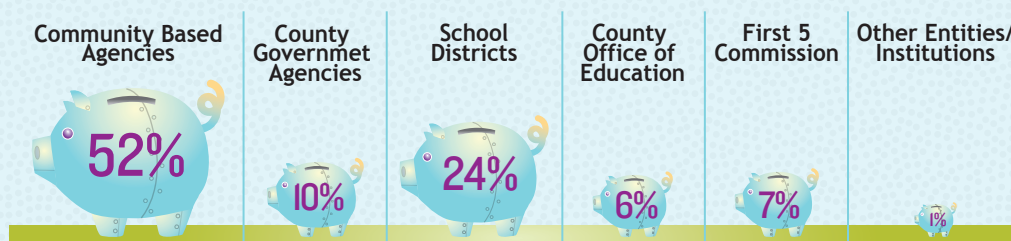
EXPENSES BY CONTENT AREA
